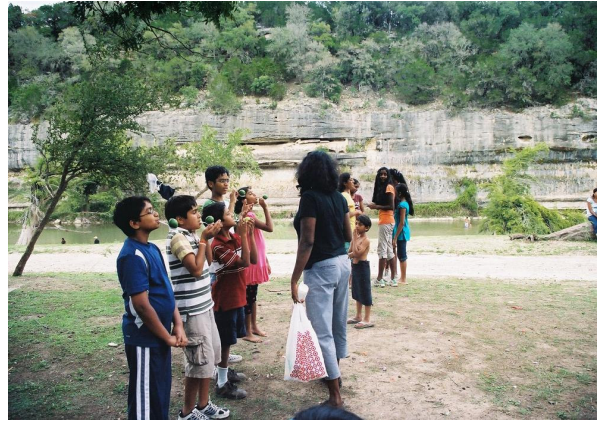

HINI Flu (Swine Flu) - Dr. Ravi Botla, FAGG
The predominant cause of the current Flu pandemic is the 2009 HINI virus. It is a new virus with genes from different flu viruses that normally infect pigs, birds and humans. It is currently wide spread in all the Southern states of US including Texas. According to the CDC, almost all of the influenza viruses identified in these states so far are 2009 HINI influenza A viruses. In the coming days, as the weather cools and children spend more time at school, many more people may become sick with the flu. Most will never know for sure if they had HINI, but if they had a fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue, that would be a safe assumption. The best defense against this form of flu is knowing all the facts.

Homage to AP Chief Minister Sri YSR



Sri Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy garu, Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh passed away in an aircraft crash. Telugu Association of San Antonio (TASA) deeply mourns the untimely demise of the most popular leader of Andhra Pradesh. His passing away leaves a great void in the hearts of Telugu people. TASA extends our deepest condolences to the family of Sri YSR. We also express our condolences to the families of 4 officials who were travelling with Sri YSR. Sri YSR will remain in thoughts and prayers of all Telugu people for a long time.

Dr. Yeduguri Sandinti Rajasekhara Reddy, popularly known as YSR, was a leader who had carved for himself a niche in State politics by his exemplary devotion and dedication to the uplift of the down-trodden and neglected segments of society. Born on July 8, 1949, in Pulivendula in the backward Rayalaseema region, YSR's early schooling was at the Municipal School in nearby Bellary town which is in Karnataka. While studying in M R Medical College, Gulbarga, Karnataka, he served as President of the Students Union. He was elected leader of the House Surgeon's Association in S V Medical College, Tirupati. After completing MBBS, he served as Medical Officer at the Jammalamadugu Mission Hospital for a brief period. In 1973, he established a 70-bed charitable hospital, named after his father late Y. S. Raja Reddy at Pulivendula. His family established one polytechnic and one degree college in Pulivendula, which were later handed over to the well-known Loyola group of institutions. He entered active politics in 1978 and contested elections, four times to enter the State Legislative Assembly and an equal number of times to enter the Lok Sabha, the Lower House of Parliament and he won all the elections he contested.

During his three decades of political career, YSR had served the people in multiple capacities, both in Government as well as in Party. He was President of the Andhra Pradesh Congress Committee (APCC) twice – 1983-1985 and 1998-2000. During 1980-1983, he was a minister holding important portfolios related to Rural Development, Medical & Health and Education etc. From 1999 to 2004 he was the Leader of Opposition in the eleventh state assembly. His emphasis on irrigation projects, particularly in the backward Rayalaseema region, has earned for him a special place in the hearts of millions of farmers. His unremitting struggle against certain anti-people economic measures that were sought to be introduced in the name of "reforms", including the frequent increases in power tariff and indiscriminate privatization of public sector units, exalted him into prominence. He undertook his unprecedented 1500-KM-long Padayatra (march on foot) in scorching sun during summer in 2003, covering backward areas of the state in particularly to know first-hand the real problems of the people in their own language and at

their doorstep propelled him into power soon. Sworn in as Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh on May 14, 2004, he remained a leader focusing on agriculture and rural welfare as ever, which won him a second term in the assembly elections held in May 2009. His advice was always simple: "Don't count the years you want to live. Ask yourself how much you have done for society at large with whatever opportunities the Almighty has provided you."

HINI Flu (Swine Flu) - Dr. Ravi Botla, FACC

How does it spread?

It is contagious from human to human as any other flu virus (Coughing, sneezing and touching a contaminated surface or object)

What are the signs and symptoms?

Fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headaches, chills, fatigue, vomiting and diarrhea

Who is at risk?

The people at greatest risk to get flu complications are children younger than 5, and people 65 and older, pregnant women, people with chronic diseases like diabetes, heart disease, kidney disease, liver disease, chronic lung disease and those with a weakened immune system.

What are the warning signs?

Children: Trouble breathing, fast breathing, bluish skin color, not drinking enough water, fever with cough, fever with rash and significant irritability
Adults: Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen, sudden dizziness, confusion, severe and persistent vomiting.

Prevention and Treatment: Common Sense Measures:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze and dispose the tissue properly
- Wash your hands with soap and water or alcohol based hand rubs
- Avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness try to stay home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone

Medicines:

Oseltamivir (Tamiflu) and Zanamivir are effective in treatment of 2009 HINI flu infection. This is advised for patients who are in the high risk group.

Vaccine: is expected to be available in the 1st or 2nd week of October

Who should get the vaccine?

Everyone over 6 months of age, but **first preference will be given to:** (i) pregnant women; (ii) Household and caregiver who are in contact with children younger than 6 months of age; (iii) Healthcare and emergency medical service personnel, (iv) Persons from 6 months to 24 years of age, Persons aged 25 through 64 years who have chronic medical conditions.

Outlook:

Most people are recovering without any medical treatment. The proportion of deaths attributed to pneumonia and HINI influenza are within the bounds of what is expected at this time of the year (except higher pediatric deaths). The virus is sensitive to available medications and the vaccine appears to be very effective.

Recommendations:

- Get vaccinated to prevent the disease
- Take commonsense measures to prevent the spread, if you already have the infection
- Seek medical attention promptly for warning signs and symptoms.

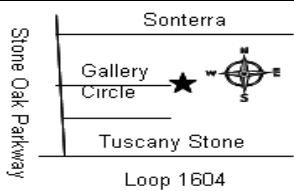
